



REGULATION NO. 2000/22

ON SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATIONS (No.1) 2000-2001

The Special Representative of the Secretary-General (hereinafter: Transitional Administrator);

Pursuant to the authority given to the Transitional Administrator under United Nations Security Council resolution 1272 (1999) of 25 October 1999;

Taking into account United Nations Transitional Administration in East Timor (UNTAET) Regulation No 1999/1 of 27 November 1999 on the Authority of the Transitional Administration in East Timor, Regulation No 2000/1 on the establishment of the Central Fiscal Authority (CFA) of East Timor;

Taking into account role of the Forças de Libertação Nacional de Timor Leste (FALINTIL);

Taking into account the need to provide for humanitarian assistance for the Forças de Libertação Nacional de Timor Leste (FALINTIL);

After consultation in the National Consultative Council (NCC);

For the purpose of appropriating money out of the Consolidated Fund of East Timor

Promulgates the following:

Section 1
Supplementary Appropriation

1.1 An amount of ONE HUNDRED AND THOUSAND US DOLLARS (US\$100,000) is appropriated by the Territorial Administration agency from the Consolidated Fund of East Timor for Goods and Services expenditures for the purpose of providing humanitarian assistance to members of the Forças de Libertação Nacional de Timor Leste (FALINTIL).

1.2 The Treasury shall issue an expenditure authorization notice for an amount of FIFTY THOUSAND US DOLLARS (US \$ 50,000) FROM THIS APPROPRIATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH Section 15 of UNTAET Regulation 2000 [UN1]/20 no later than 10 days from the date of enactment of the present regulation. An expenditure authorization notice for the remaining FIFTY THOUSAND US DOLLARS (US \$ 50,000) shall be issued no later than 14 August 2000.

1.3 The appropriation provided for in the present regulation is supplementary to the appropriation provided by UNTAET Regulation 2000[UN2]/21.

Section 2
Entry into Force

The present regulation shall enter into force on 04 July 2000.
