FORCE COMMANDER WELCOMES GHANBATT-11

Freetown, Sierra Leone- The Force Commander of the United Nations Mission in Sierra Leone (UNAMSIL), Major General Sajjad Akram, yesterday paid a working visit to the Ghanaian Battalion 11 (Ghanbatt11) in the southern Bo Town, to formally welcome them into the Mission area.

On arrival, he was received by Ghanbatt11's Commanding Officer, Lt Col Omane Agyekum, followed by a review of a Quarter Guard mounted in his honour.

Senior officers gave detailed and comprehensive briefings about the operational deployment of the battalion and the general security situation within their area of responsibility.
