## **BURUNDI - DECLARATION**

Secretary-General of the United Nations, Esteemed Members of the Assembly, Ladies and Gentlemen, all diplomatic protocols observed,

On behalf of the Government and the peace-loving people of Burundi, allow me to begin by expressing our gratitude to the Federal Republic of Germany for hosting this important United Nations Ministerial Meeting on Peacekeeping, as well as for the warm hospitality extended to all delegations, including that of my country, Burundi.

My delegation commends the United Nations and its Secretary-General, Mr. António Guterres, for their foresight in organizing this gathering at such a critical juncture. It is imperative that Member States reaffirm their commitments and adapt to the shifting global landscape, ensuring that our collective efforts remain relevant and impactful.

In this respect, Burundi pledges to deploy one infantry battalion and three formed police units, with one of the latter comprising more than 50% women as a testament to our unwavering commitment to gender parity. Additionally, we are prepared to offer two aviation units, equipped with attack and utility helicopters, instrumental in medical evacuations, personnel security, logistics, and aerial reconnaissance. Furthermore, Burundi is committed to providing 200 military experts and 200 police officers specialized in key operational areas.

Finally, my delegation reaffirms Burundi's commitment to working in harmony with all United Nations bodies and our international partners. Together, we shall tackle today's challenges, alleviate ongoing tensions worldwide, and confront climate change and its catastrophic consequences. We must ensure that our collective efforts foster an enduring peace, enabling future generations to inherit a safer, more prosperous world.
