PLEDGE STATEMENT

UN PEACEKEEPING MINISTERIAL 2025 PLEDGING SESSION 1 TRAINING AND CAPACITY BUILDING, PARTNERSHIPS, CROSS-CUTTING ISSUES

> 14 MAY 2025 BERLIN, GERMANY

Excellencies, Distinguished participants,

- 1. For more than six decades, Indonesia has stood at the forefront of UN Peacekeeping Operations.
- 2. Since 1957, more than 55.000 Indonesian have served proudly under the UN banner a testament of Indonesia's strong commitment to international peace and multilateralism.
- 3. Today, 2.775 Indonesians are deployed in various missions, including 203 women, carrying the UN Mandate.
- 4. Our participation goes beyond numbers, Indonesia strives to ensure that our personnel are well-equipped to carry out their mandates while also protecting their safety and security.
- 5. Indonesia believes that sustained and timely support from Member States and our peacekeepers is **essential** in ensuring the continuity and effectivity of Peacekeeping Operations.
 - ➔ In particular during this challenging time when resources are more scarced and limited.
- 6. Indonesia's commitment to UN Peacekeeping Operations is beyond than a legacy, we are determined to **sustain and strengthen** our contributions.
- 7. Towards that end, Indonesia is pleased to announce the following pledges:
 - → Deployment of **one engineering company**, consisting of 240 troops.
 - → Deployment of one Level 2 Hospital unit, comprising of 67 troops.
 - → Deployment of one Formed Police Unit (FPU) and one Special Intervention Team for the Rapid Deployment Level (RDL) Cycle 2025/2026, with a total of 175 police.
- 8. Following our pledge in 2023, Indonesia will continue to enhance our Armed Forces Peacekeeping Center and Police International Mission Center to better serve as a training hub for international peacekeepers.
- 9. Since our pledge in 2023, both centers have hosted 16 Trainings, both for troops and police, with more than 140 international participants... and we intend to do more.

10. Indonesia hopes the commitment we pledge today will pave the way for the future of peacekeeping that is... fit-for-purpose, fit-forchallenges, and fit-for-success. Let us reaffirm our collective commitment in the spirit of global peace. Thank you.
