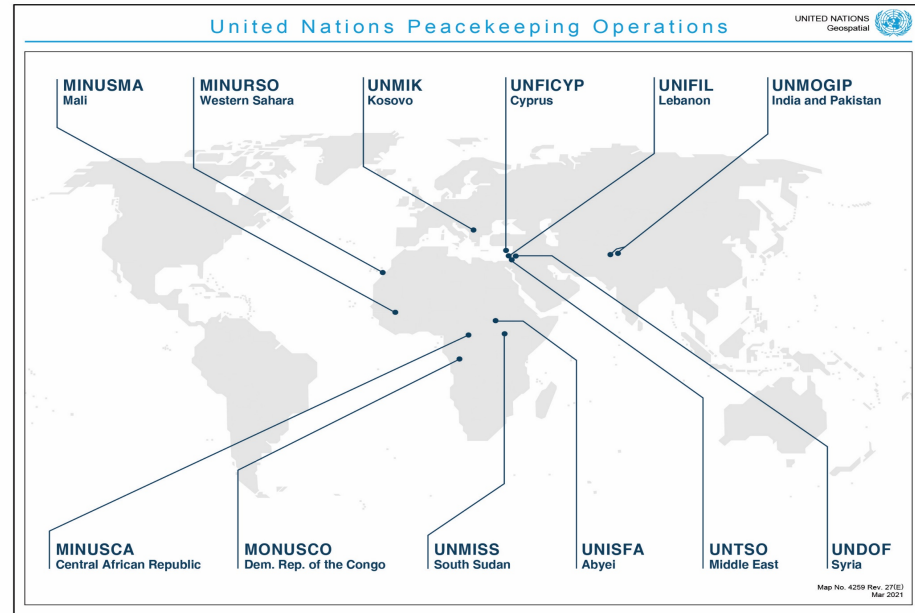

FINANCIAL ASPECTS (US\$)

Approved budgets for the period from 1 July 2020 to 30 June 2021	About 6.5 billion**
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*Includes fatalities for all UN peacekeeping operations, as well as political and peacebuilding missions.

The approved budget for UN Peacekeeping operations for the fiscal year 1 July 2020 - 30 June 2021 is \$6.58 billion. (A/C.5/73/21). This amount finances 10 of the 12**** current United Nations peacekeeping missions. The remaining two peacekeeping missions, the UN Truce Supervision Organisation (UNTSO)* and the UN Military Observer Group in India and Pakistan (UNMOGIP)*, are financed through the UN regular budget. The peacekeeping budget also pays for UNAMID***, which closed at the end of 2020 and is currently withdrawing; supports logistics for the African Union Mission in Somalia (AMISOM); and provides support, technology and logistics to all peace operations through global service centres in Brindisi (Italy), and a regional service centre in Entebbe (Uganda).
