Bangladesh	Increase the number of female peacekeepers; operational-level Unmanned Aerial System (UAS) for peacekeeping
Belarus (Did not speak)	Force Protection platoon
Belgium	Mobile Training Teams for MINUSMA for four six-week trainings

Ireland	Conduct 2 courses on Protection of Civilians, host a Buddy First Aid medical course, and conduct 2 Counter-Improvised Explosive Device Training and Mine awareness training programs in Burkina Faso in association with United Nations Mine Action Service in support of the Sahel G5 Taskforce, and deliver two mission-tailored UN Staff Officer training courses funding personnel from other Troop Contributing Countries
