Senegal military personnel are regarded as on duty twenty four hours when deployed in operations.
SEA: military offence?	Sexual Exploitation and Abuse is not a military crime. Acts which are categorized as SEA by the UN, would largely fall under the military and penal codes of Senegal.
Powers of the Commanding Officer (CO)	The Commanding Officer has administrative, investigative and disciplinary powers.
INVESTIGATION	
Who can investigate?	The Civilian Police (Prévoté) and Civilian Judges are empowered to investigate sexual exploitation and abuse allegations.
National Investigation Officer (NIO)	National Investigation Officers are deployed with units.
PROSECUTION	
Referral	The National Investigation Officers refer completed investigations to civilian prosecutors.
Who can charge?	The civilian prosecutors are mandated to charge.
JUSTICE	
Military justice	Senegal has a military justice system.
Deployable Court Martial?	Senegal does not have a peace time deployable court matial system.
